The film's story simply follows a boy named Mason (Coltrane) as he progresses from age 6 to 18 and deals with the typical travails of childhood like his parents' divorce, bad stepparents, falling in love, finding his artistic voice, and fighting with his bratty older sister. STONEHEARST ASYLUM

On Christmas Eve, 1899, Edward Newgate (Sturgess) arrives at the imposing gates of Stonehearst Mental Asylum, eager to be granted an apprenticeship with the superintendent. Edward observes patients including the beautiful Eliza Graves (Beckinsale) whom are celebrated as individuals in their natural, unadulterated state of lunacy. However, one night Edward notices a noise coming from the vent in his sleeping quarters. Intrigued, he follows the sound down into the dark asylum cellar. At first unsure of his surroundings, he is astonished to discover the superintendent's predecessor and others locked behind bars. Knowing he must intervene before it is too late, Edward struggles to find a way to save the prisoners and restore order at Stonehearst, but his efforts will be futile without the love and affection of the mysterious Eliza Graves.




FRANK

THE DOG

Coming of age in the 1960s, John Wojtowicz took pride in being a pervert. His libido was excessive even by the libertine standards of the era, with multiple wives and lovers, both women and men. In August, 1972, he attempted to rob a Brooklyn bank to finance his lover's sex-reassignment surgery. The attempted heist resulted in a fourteen-hour hostage situation that was broadcast on TV. Three years later, Pacino portrayed his character instigating the unforgettable crime on the big screen. The award-winning film had a profound influence on Wojtowicz. When he emerged from prison six years later, he became known as "The Dog." Filmed over the course of a 10-year period the documentary captures the many sides of Wojtowicz. To call him larger than life feels like an understatement.

REVENGE OF THE GREEN DRAGONS

In the vein of crime classics like Mean Streets and Infernal Affairs, Revenge of the Green Dragons follows two immigrant brothers Sonny (Justin Chon) and Steven (Kevin Wu) who survive the impoverished despair of New York in the 1980s by joining Chinatown gang "The Green Dragons". The brothers quickly rise up the ranks, drawing the unwanted attention of hard-boiled city cops. After an ill-fated love affair pits Sonny against his own brother, he sets out for revenge on the very gang who made him who he is. From acclaimed Director Andrew Lau and Andrew Loo, and legendary Executive Producer Martin Scorsese comes a brilliant mix between a Hong Kong action film and a New York City crime thriller, portraying the never-beforetold true story of "The Green Dragons."

FRONTERA

An investigation into the murder of a sheriff's wife on the Arizona/ Mexico border proves less cut-and-dry than initial appearances suggest in this topical drama from writer/director Michael Berry. As a Mexican man (Michael Peña) attempts to cross illegally into the United States, his encounter with a sheriff's wife (Amy Madigan) is cut short when rifle shots ring out across the desert. When the dust clears, the woman lies dead. At first, all evidence points to the illegal man as the killer, but as the former sheriff (Ed Harris) teams with the current sheriff (Aden Young) to investigate, it quickly becomes apparent that there are more sinister forces at play. As the two lawmen work to unearth the truth, however, they are faced with difficult questions that force them to ponder the value of human life, and the true price of justice.

FORCE MAJEURE

A critical favorite at this year's Cannes Film Festival, where it took the Jury Prize in Un Certain Regard, this wickedly funny and precisely observed psychodrama tells the story of a model Swedish family–handsome businessman Tomas, his willowy wife Ebba and their two blond children–on a skiing holiday in the French Alps. The sun is shining and the slopes are spectacular but, during a lunch at a mountainside restaurant, an avalanche suddenly bears down on the happy diners. With people fleeing in all directions and his wife and children in a state of panic, Tomas makes a decision that will shake his marriage to its core and leave him struggling to reclaim his role as family patriarch.



TWO-BIT WALTZ

In the wonderfully dysfunctional tradition of *The Royal Tenenbaums*, teenage years are always messy... but for Maude, things couldn't seem more tragic. Within one week just prior to her 18th birthday, she is suspended from school, stranded by her best friend, dumped by the boy she "loves", and Granny just died leaving her an enormous amount of money under one condition: Maude must go to college which she does not want to do and her wildly eccentric family is no help at all. 


