Showcasing Hilary's own handheld video footage, as well as original Eloise drawings brought to life through delightful animation, *It's Me, Hilary: The Man Who Drew Eloise* shines a light on a talented and inspired artist, who has persevered through professional and personal obstacles – including his estrangement from Thompson, who forbade him from ever drawing Eloise again – all while embracing the lighter side of life.

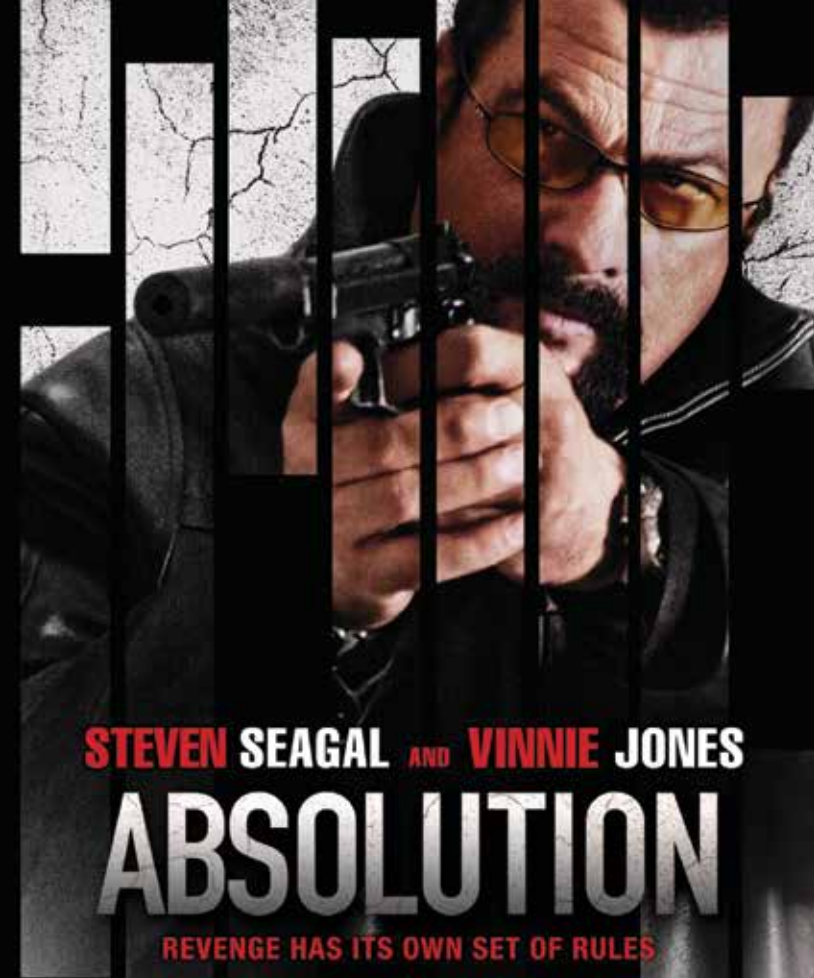
Rosie O'Donnell: A Heartfelt Stand Up
